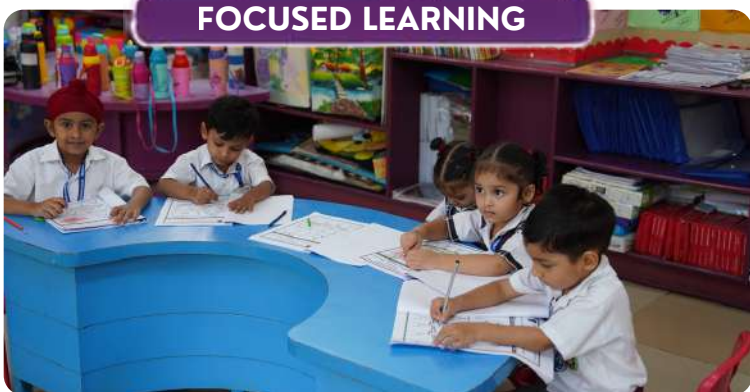

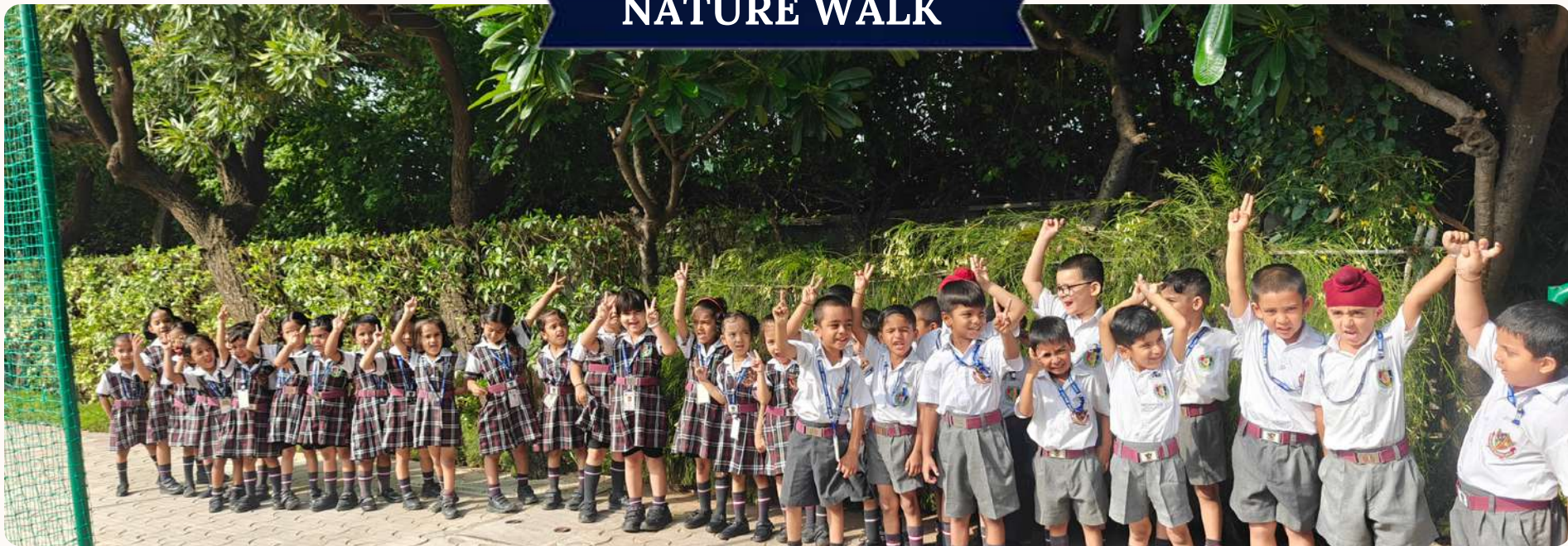

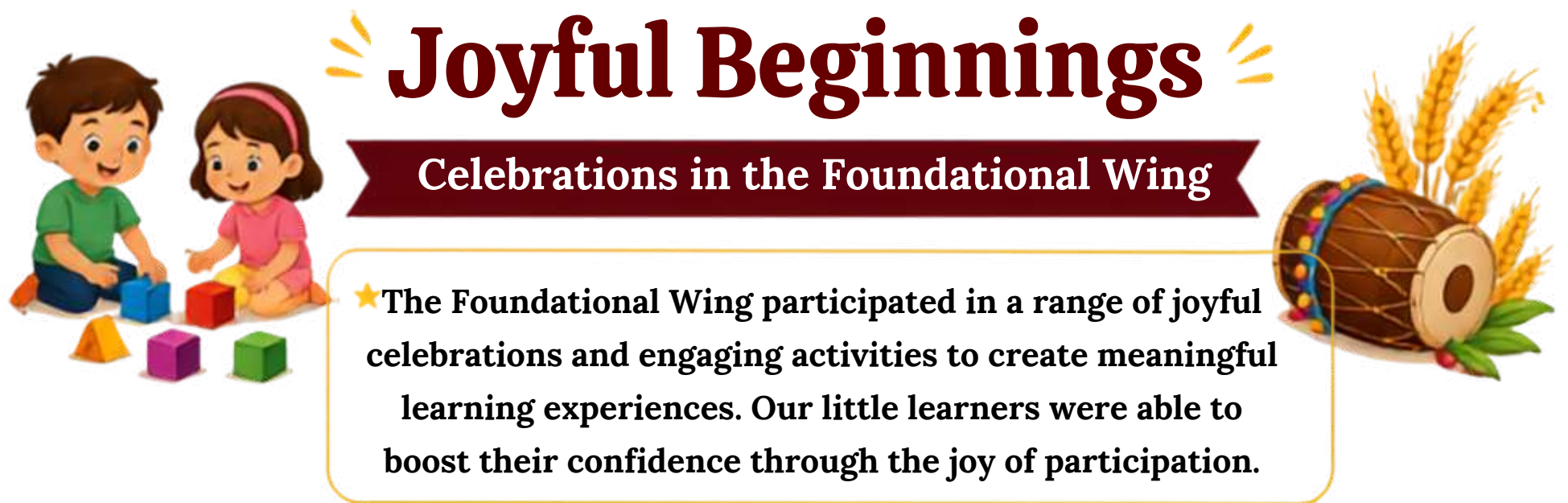

SEGREGATE SMART: CREATE & SPEAK

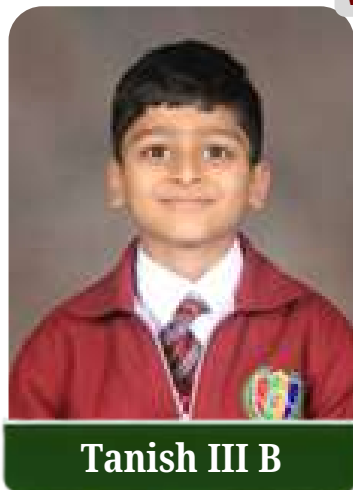
